## The Epistle - 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

I would remind you, brothers and sisters, of the good news that I proclaimed to you, which you in turn received, in which also you stand, through which also you are being saved, if you hold firmly to the message that I proclaimed to you—unless you have come to believe in vain.

For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me has not been in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them—though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. Whether then it was I or they, so we proclaim and so you have come to believe.

And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. They had been saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you." So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

# Holy Baptism of Maverick Leonard Woods

Baptismal Hymn: With One Voice, #693, Baptized in Water

#### The Presentation and Examination of the Candidate

**BCP 301** 

Presider: The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Parents and Godparents:

I present Maverick Leonard Woods to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Presider: Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought

up in the Christian faith and life?

Parents and Godparents;

I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the

full stature of Christ?

Parents and Godparents:

I will, with God's help.

Then the Presider asks the following questions of the parents and godparents who speak on behalf of the child.

Question: Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that

rebel against God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Question: Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and

destroy the creatures of God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Question: Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Question: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

Answer: I do.

Question: Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Answer: I do.

Question: Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

Answer: I do.

The Presider addresses the congregation, saying

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support this child in him life in Christ?

People: We will.

The Presider then says these or similar words

Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

## The Baptismal Covenant

**BCP 304** 

Presider: Do you believe in God the Father?

People: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Presider: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit

and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven,

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Presider: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People: I believe in the Holy Spirit,

the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,

the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Presider: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the

breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin,

repent, and return to the Lord?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in

Christ?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as

yourself?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the

dignity of every human being?

People: I will, with God's help.

## **Prayers for the Candidates**

**BCP 305** 

The Presider then says to the congregation

Let us now pray for this child who is to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

A Person appointed leads the following petitions

Leader: Deliver them, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: Open their hearts to your grace and truth.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: Fill them with your holy and life-giving Spirit.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: Keep them in the faith and communion of your holy Church.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: Teach them to love others in the power of the Spirit.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: Send them into the world in witness to your love.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: Bring them to the fullness of your peace and glory.

People: Lord, hear our prayer

The Presider says

Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and for ever. **Amen.** 

# Thanksgiving over the Water

The Presider blesses the water, first saying

The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Presider: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Presider: We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water.

Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage

in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death

and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore, in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

At the following words, the Presider touches the water

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.** 

## The Baptism and Anointing

The candidate is presented by name to the Presider, who then immerses, or pours water upon the candidate, saying Maverick, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.** 

Then the Priest places a hand on the candidate's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross and saying

Maverick, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. **Amen.** 

The priest lights a candle from the Easter Candle and hands it to a family member.

Maverick, receive the light of Christ, a sign of the new life enkindled within you. Share it with the world as a follower of Jesus. **Amen.** 

## The Prayer and Welcoming of the Newly Baptized

**BCP 308** 

Let us pray together.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised him to the new life of grace. Sustain him, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give him an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. Amen.

The Presider says
Let us welcome the newly baptized.

Presider and People

We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

## The Sprinkling Rite

The congregation is blessed with holy water from the font in recollection of our rebirth and renewal in baptism.

#### The Peace

Presider: The peace of the Lord be always with you.

**People:** And also with you.
